
Our students want to express their gratitude for the opportunity to attend events like CSM and encourage their fellow students to make the effort when possible!

At this year's CSM, FranU's own Dr. Jaime Caillet was awarded as one of the poster presenters in the Education Section. The research, "Incorporating MSK Ultrasound into Physical Therapy Education: A Retrospective Analysis," was completed alongside Dr. Albert Swafford, Dr. Michael Ludwig, Dr. Phil Page, and Dr. Jeff Thompson.

Their study aimed to highlight the useability of MSKUS in a DPT education due to its easy use, feasibility and enhancement of anatomy understanding. The study specifically looked at the knowledge of students

and their respective confidence in their ability to utilize MSKUS. Dr. Caillet and colleagues found that with an increase in use of MSKUS came a significant positive change in knowledge and confidence, not only with the use of MSKUS, but also with their understanding of anatomy.

Dr. Caillet believes their study proves that MSKUS is a viable tool that can augment PT education. Lastly, Dr. Caillet expressed her excitement to be a part of a high-quality study worthy of presentation at CSM!

A New Way to View Anatomy: Virtual Reality Edition

Virtual reality is the latest addition to FranU's anatomy laboratory experience. Procured through an endowment, these virtual reality units are another example of DPT Program's dedication to advancements in teaching methods and making the latest technologies available to our students. With these headsets, our students can view a three-dimensional anatomy application called 3D Organon, in which they are immersed in an interactive and impactful view of anatomy. In this application on the virtual reality headsets, our students can view structures in ways that are impossible through other methods, such as the diaphragm from the underside as they literally look up from inside the abdominal cavity. This unique view will give our students a better understanding of the truly three-dimensional nature of anatomy.

Making Waves at APTA Louisiana Spring Symposium 2024




We want to extend a huge shoutout and congratulations to the number of students that presented posters and platforms at the APTA Spring Symposium in March! Many 2nd and 3rd year student research posters were accepted to be presented this year and even two groups were awarded a platform presentation. One of the platform presentations was given by 2nd year students Abby Trahan and Hannah Vicknair. The aim of their research was to provide evidence on devices to measure different characteristics of fascia including thickness, stiffness or elasticity, and displacement. When asked about their platform and research Trahan explained, "We were trying to determine the reliability and validity of the measurements and devices because previously there was no comparison to a gold standard like MRI or histology."

Additionally, 2nd year students Meredith Darnell and Destiny Bell were awarded with 1st place poster presentation at the Symposium for their research on Effectiveness of an Exercise Program in Cancer Patients. Darnell explained, "We performed pre- and post testing with common outcome measures including 6 Minute Walk and TUG while the patients were enrolled in a 12-week exercise program. We saw a significant improvement in endurance and lower extremity strength, which we see as valuable data for this population." Destiny and Meredith want to express their gratitude for this opportunity and support to Dr. Angle Page and Dr. Phil Page!

Lastly, 2nd Year Hannah Vicknair was presented with the Dr. Dave Pariser Student Service Award for all her hard work and dedication to her community and future profession. The FranU community is so proud of everything she has accomplished, and to all of the students who attended and presented, we commend you for your great dedication to excellence in the PT community!
